CFTA Route to Licensure for Family or Specialists Practice

Step 1

- Create a profile using the <u>online portal</u>
- You will need to upload:
 - Proof of completion of the <u>Yukon First Nations 101 course</u>. You must complete this course in order to obtain a licence in the Yukon.
 - Proof of CMPA insurance indicating coverage in Yukon.
 - A copy of your CV.
 - A copy of a Canadian government-issued identification (e.g., passport)
- Request a certificate of standing from all jurisdictions where you are currently licensed be sent directly to YMC@yukon.ca

NOTE: YMC reserves the right to request an applicant complete the physciansapply application and/or request additional certificates of standing at the discretion of the Registrar's office.

Step 2 Important

Complete and submit your CFTA Licence Application.

**If you do not see an "apply" button, you are likely missing supporting documents

Other information:

- Once our office has received all your certificates of standing, your file will go for YMC review.
- Once approved, you will receive an email requesting you log in and pay. Once
 your payment is received your licence will be released.
 - Note: at this time licences only appear on the public register on the effective date. You can download a copy of your licence if required for privileges or billing setup purposes
- Full Independent licences must be renewed annually. You will be sent a reminder email with links to renew and instructions on striking your licence if you wish to cancel Yukon licensure.

• The average time to process an application is 4 weeks. However, If you do not hear from us within 10 days please reach out the YMC@yukon.ca

Next steps

- You must apply for hospital privileges after getting your Yukon licence and before
 providing patient care in Yukon hospitals. You must initiate this process directly
 with the Yukon Hospital Corporation. yhchospitalprivileges@wgh.yk.ca
- If you are practicing medicine through a corporation, you must <u>apply for a professional corporation permit</u>.

Minimum Licensing requirements

Physicians wishing to practice medicine in Yukon must:

- be a licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada; and
- hold:
 - a certificate of fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or a specialty certification issued by the Collège des médecins du Québec; or
 - the College of Family Physicians of Canada (or a family medicine certificate issued by the Collège des médecins du Québec

or

 hold a current full licence in another Province or Territory of Canada that is a party to the Canadian Free Trade Agreement. (CFTA)
