

Assessing the Mental Capacity of a Patient

<u>Standards of Practice</u> of the Yukon Medical Council ("the Council") are the minimum standards of professional behavior and ethical conduct expected of all physicians registered in the Yukon. Standards of Practice will be referenced in the management of complaints and in discipline.

- 1. A physician conducting an assessment of a patient's mental capacity must:
 - a. attempt to obtain the patient's agreement to participate;
 - assess the patient's capacity to understand information relevant to the topic at hand;
 - c. assess the patient's capacity to understand the decisions to be made;
 - d. assess the patient's capacity to understand the risks and benefits of actions that may be undertaken;
 - e. assess the patient's ability to justify his or her choices; and
 - f. use accepted clinical means to determine mental capacity.

Terms used in the Standards of Practice:

- Physician means any person who is registered or who is required to be registered under the Medical Profession Act.
- Must refers to a mandatory requirement.
- May means that the physician may exercise reasonable discretion.
- Patient includes, where applicable, the patient's legal guardian or substitute decision maker.
